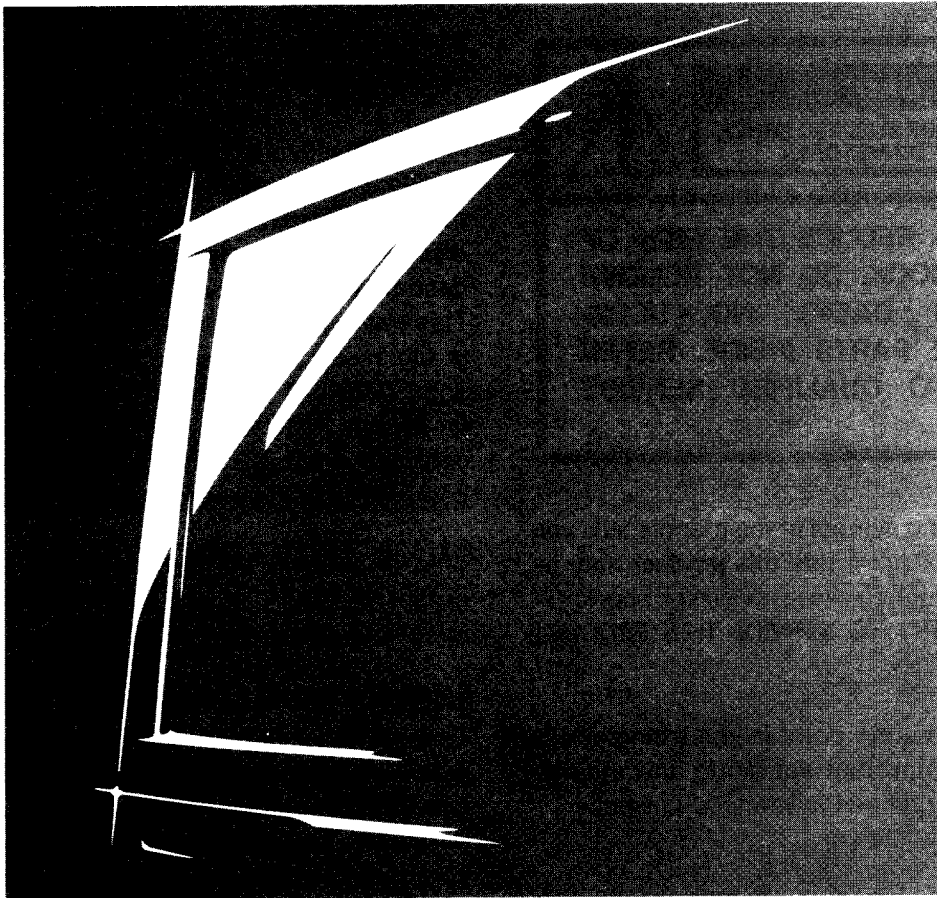

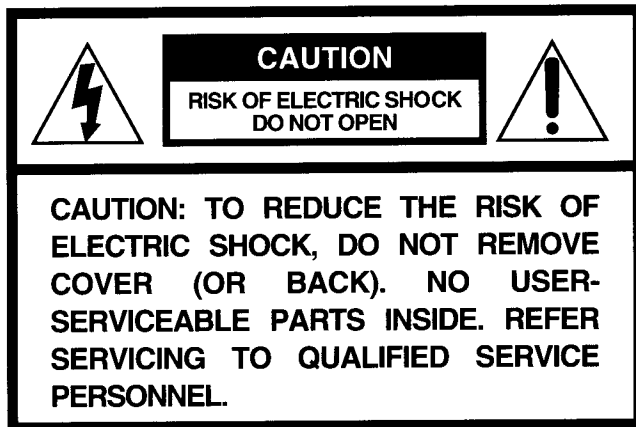

INSTALLING YOUR TV SET

WARNING:

TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY

- Do not place the TV on an uneven floor or an unstable stand.
- Do not stand or climb on the TV.
- Do not put a VCR or any heavy object on top of the TV.

DO NOT:

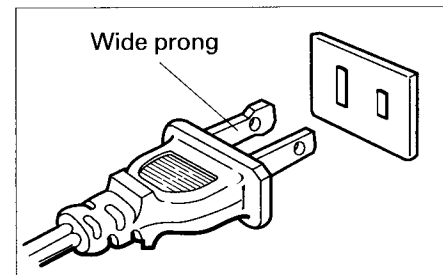
- Place your TV set in a room where direct lighting strikes the screen.
- Place your TV set too close to a wall, in a confined area or in a very warm location.
- Change the plug's safety prong.

DO:

- Use soft and indirect lighting.
- Sit at least 6 feet away from the set.
- Provide normal air circulation for reliable long life.
- Plug into an electrical outlet with standard house power (120 volt AC, 60 Hz).

CAUTION:

As a safety feature, the plug has one prong wider than the other. It will fit only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, try turning it around. If the plug will not fit either way, the outlet is probably old and non-standard. You will need to have a new outlet installed by an electrician. DO NOT CHANGE THE SAFETY FEATURE OF THE PLUG.



ANTENNA/CABLE TV GENERAL INFORMATION

You can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna to receive VHF and/or UHF channels.

Channels 2-13 are VHF channels, and channels 14-69 are UHF channels.

We recommend using an outdoor antenna for better picture quality.

You can receive Cable TV by connecting a cable supplied by your local cable company.

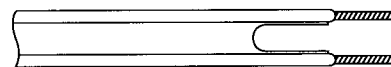
Cable TV delivers both VHF and UHF channels and other channels not available from your antenna.

TYPES OF ANTENNA CABLES

Shown below are two basic types of antenna cables. Signals from a home antenna may be conducted through either type. Cable TV signals will always be conducted through 75 ohm coaxial cable.

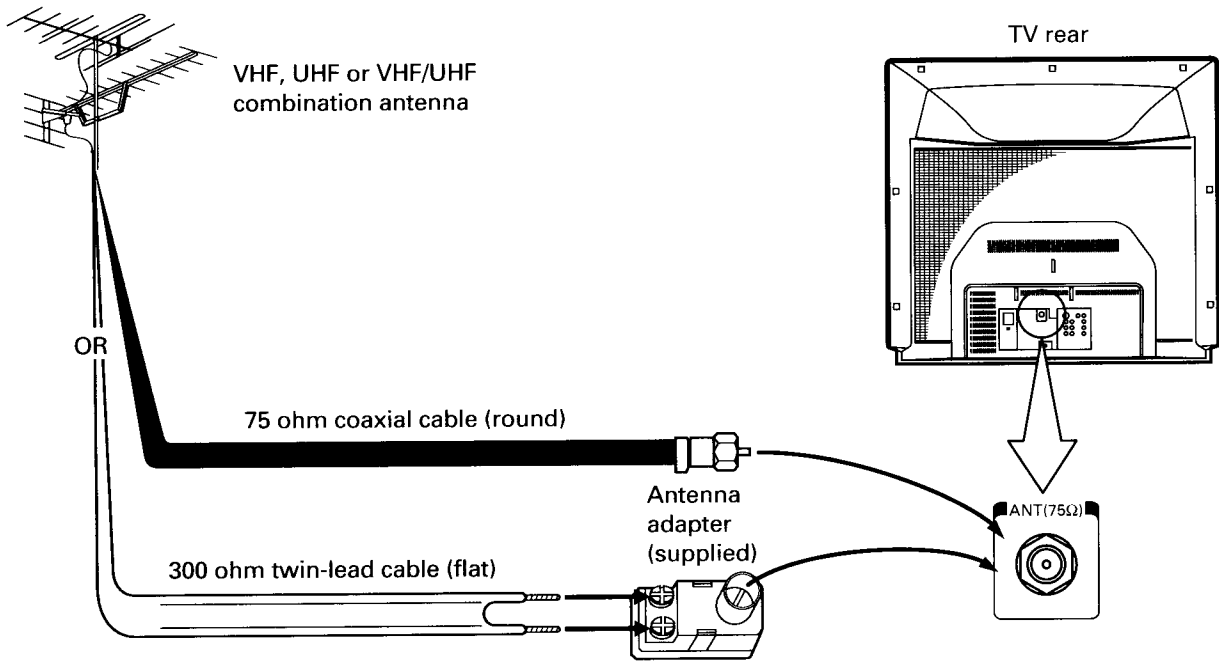
1. A 75 ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connectors that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools.
2. A 300 ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a terminal through an antenna adapter supplied as an accessory.

Optional F-type connector

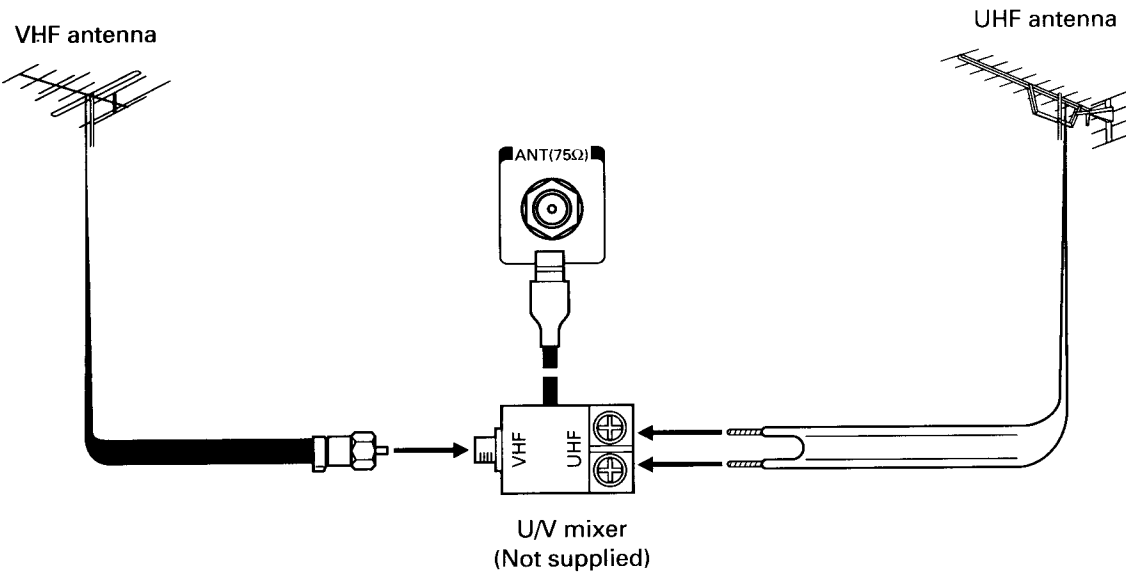


HOME ANTENNA CONNECTION

Connecting both VHF and UHF lead-in cables

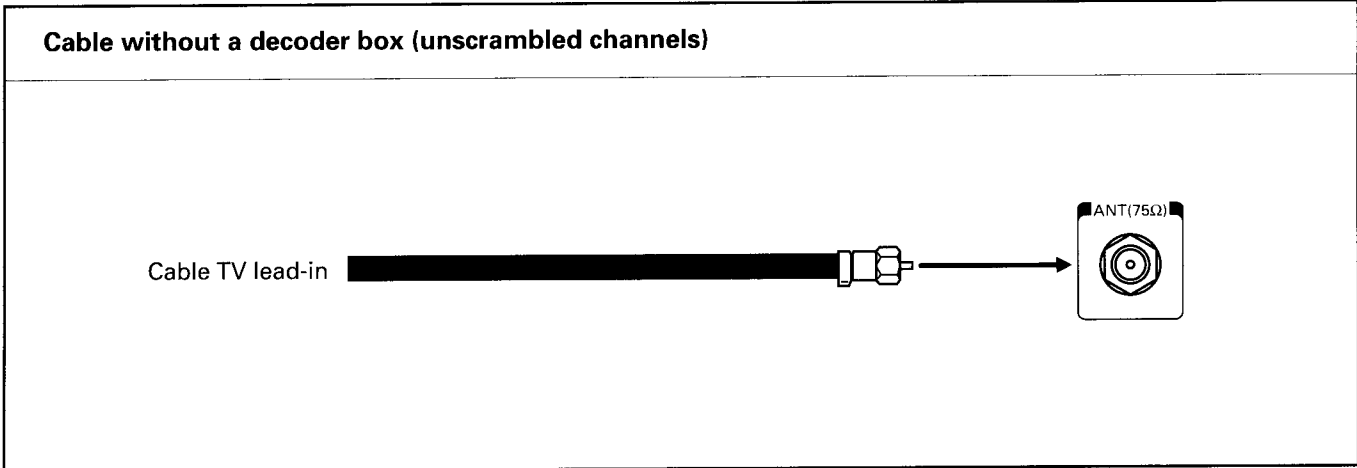

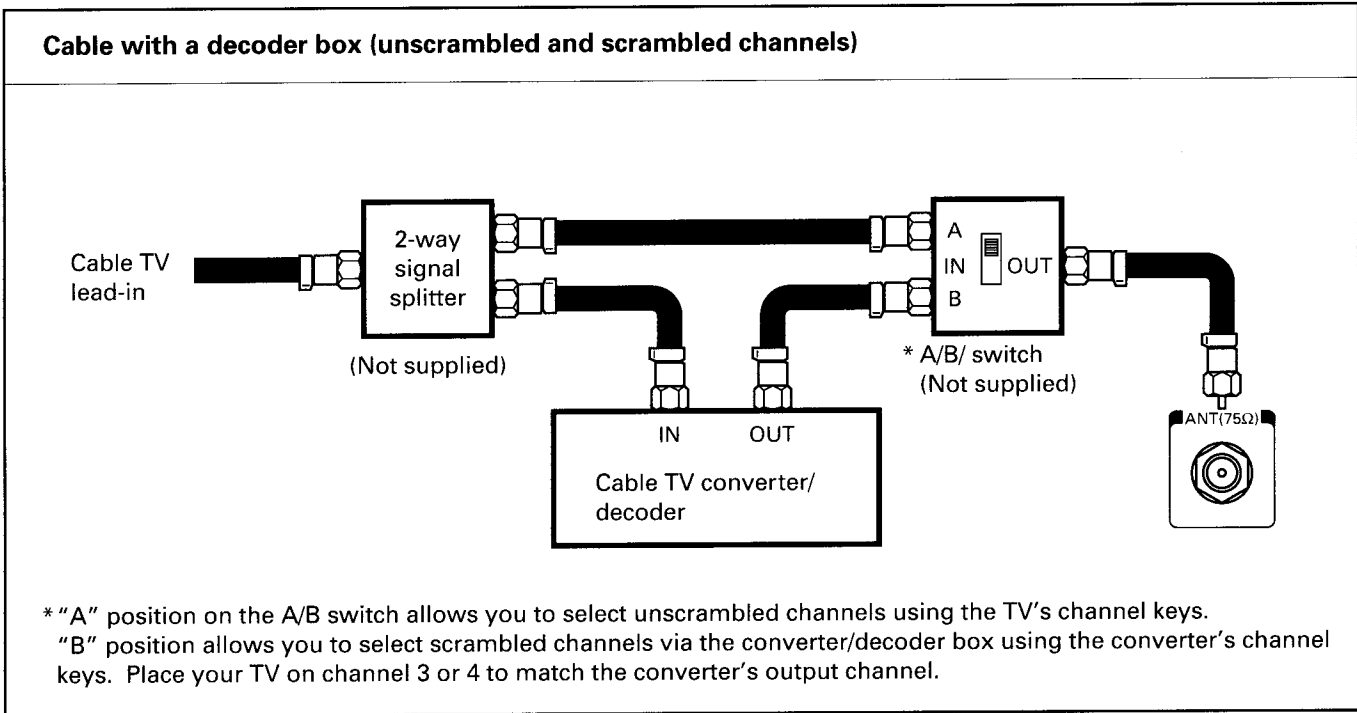

CABLE TV CONNECTIONS

Generally, the incoming cable for a Cable TV system can be connected directly to the TV antenna terminal just like a home antenna connection. Simply attach it to the ANT (75Ω) terminal. You will be able to receive unscrambled cable channels.



Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels". Since the signals of these premium pay channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/decoder is generally provided to the subscriber by the cable TV company. This decoder box is necessary for normal viewing of the scrambled channels. For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company.

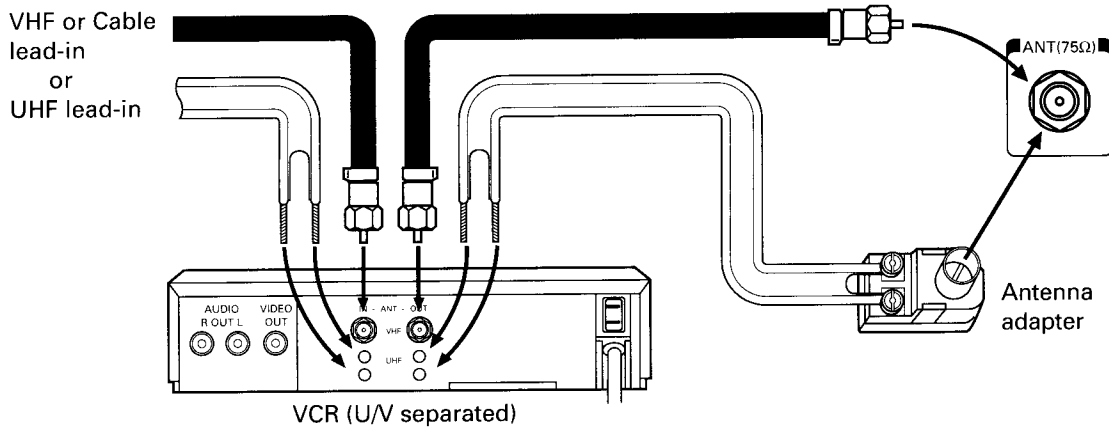


Notes:

- The descrambler device may or may not be a part of cable converter.
- Since cable systems vary, you may wish to consult your local cable company for additional information.

ANTENNA/CABLE TV AND VCR CONNECTIONS

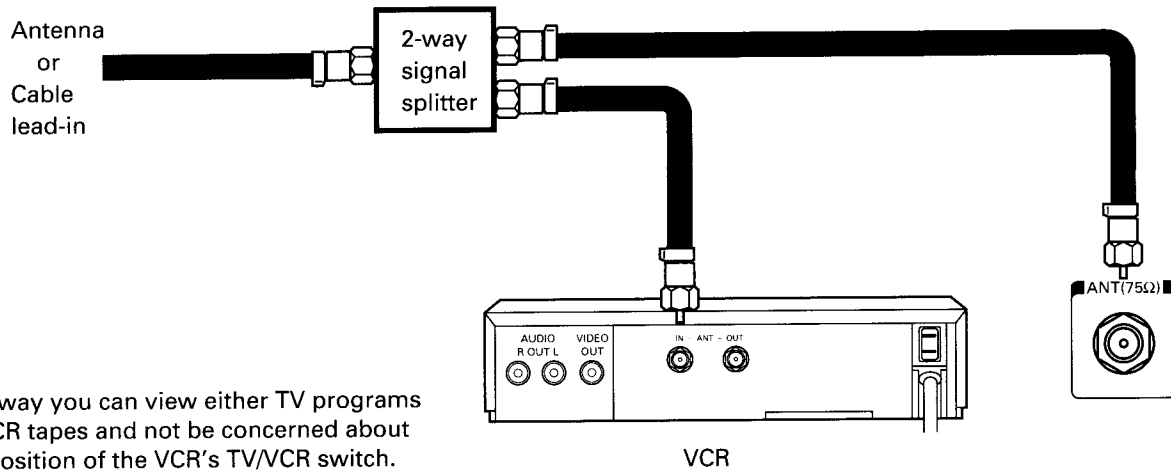
Antenna/Cable connection via VCR (simplified method)



Notes:

- On many VCR's, playing tapes causes the VCR's TV/VCR switching to disconnect the antenna signals from the TV. If you cannot select a certain channel, try pressing the TV/VCR button on the Remote Control.
- If you connect both VHF and UHF lead-in cables, use an optional U/V mixer. See page 5.

Using a 2-way signal splitter

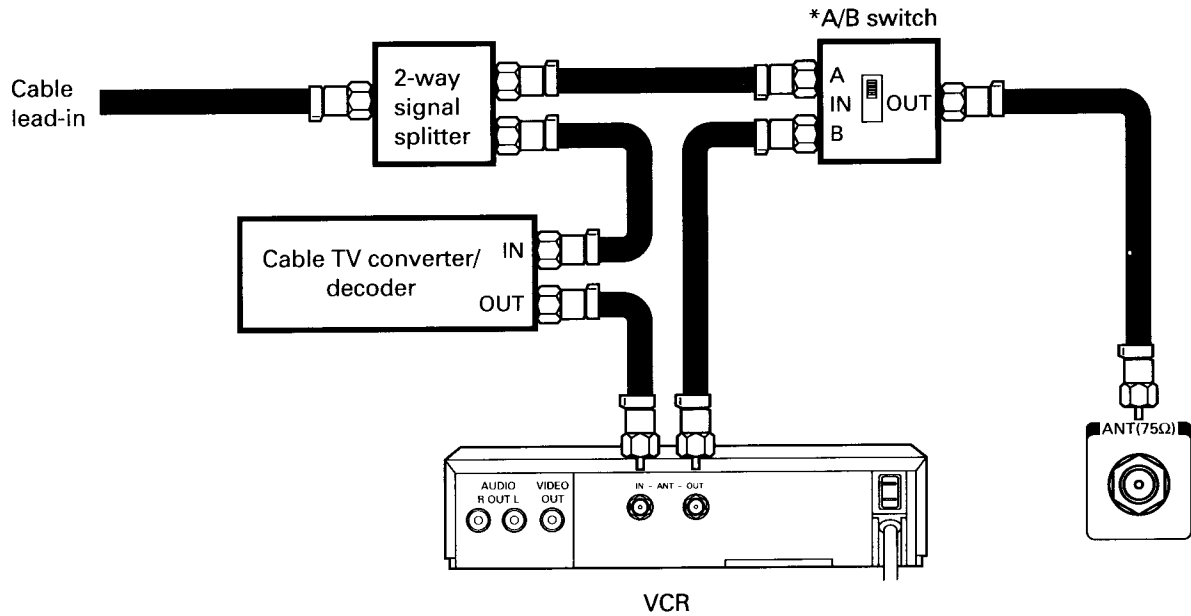


This way you can view either TV programs or VCR tapes and not be concerned about the position of the VCR's TV/VCR switch.

Note: When connected either way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for PIP (Picture in Picture) viewing and for (stereo) play-back from VCR's. See page 41 for connection details.

ANTENNA/CABLE TV AND VCR CONNECTIONS (Continued)

Cable with a converter/decoder box

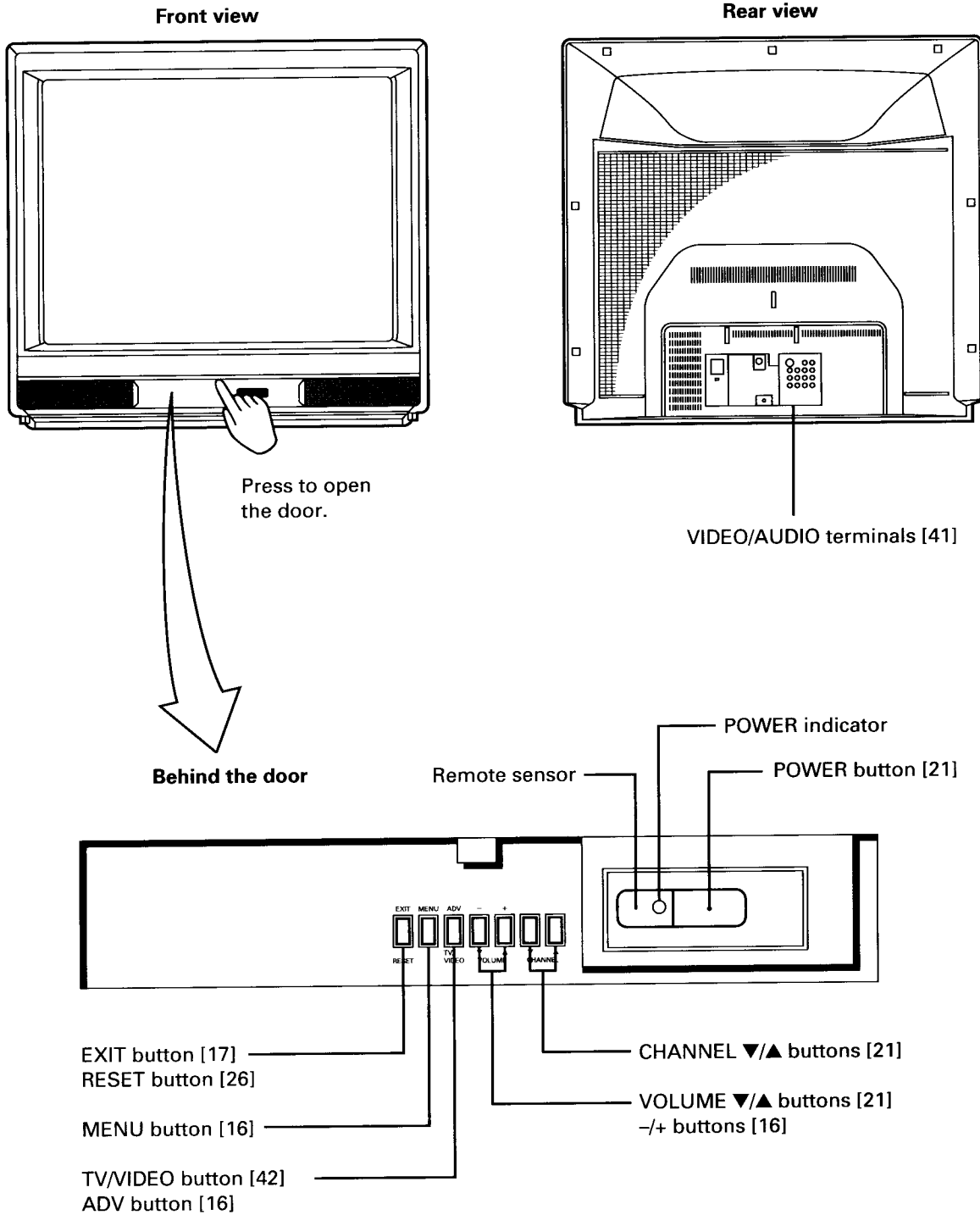


*"A" position on the A/B switch allows you to select unscrambled channels using the TV's channel keys.
"B" position on the A/B switch allows you to select scrambled channels via the cable TV converter/decoder using the converter's channel keys. Place your TV and VCR on channel 3 or 4 to match the converter's output channel.

Note: When connected this way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for PIP (Picture in Picture) viewing and for stereo playback from stereo VCR's. See page 41 for connection details.

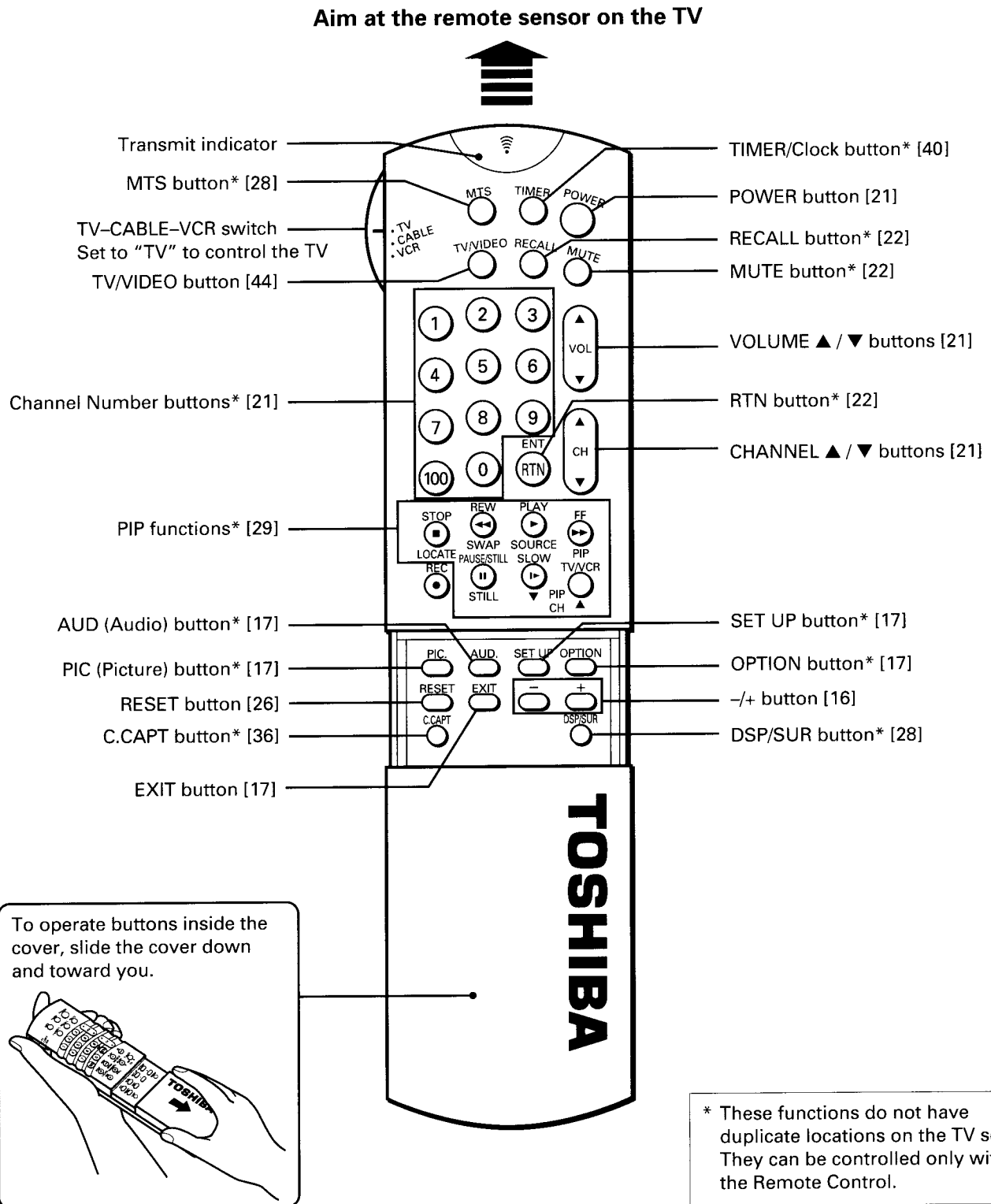

BEFORE USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

INTRODUCTIONS

With this Remote Control, you can operate your TV and most models of remote-controlled VCR's and Cable TV Converters even if they are different brands.

However, this Remote Control must be programmed to control other brands of VCR's and/or Converters. If you will be using your TV set with a TOSHIBA VCR, your remote has already been preprogrammed for you.

- Before attempting to operate your Remote Control, install the batteries according to the section "INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES" shown below.
- For more detailed instructions, see the section "PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL" on the page 13.

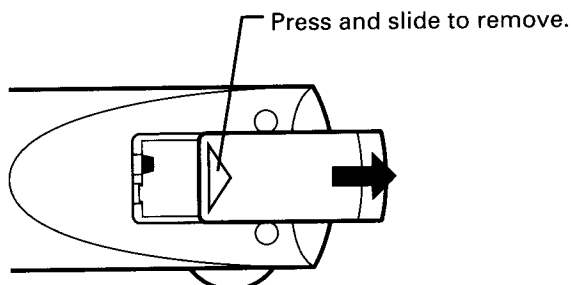
Notes:

- After installing new batteries, the Remote Control will set itself to the codes for TOSHIBA's TV and VCR. If you are using the Remote Control to operate equipment that uses different codes, it will have to be reprogrammed for those codes.
- This Remote Control may have functions not available on the original remote control.
- These functions may or may not operate your VCR or Cable TV Converter. Refer to the owner's manuals supplied with the equipments to see which functions are available.
- The remote control supplied with your VCR or Cable TV Converter may have keys not duplicated on this Remote Control. If these functions are desired, the original remote will have to be used.

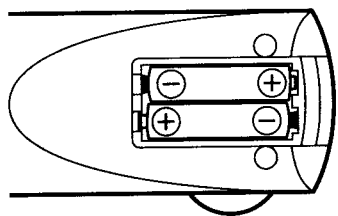

INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES

- 1 Place the Remote Control with the face down. Press down on the ridged area of the battery cover and slide it off.



- 2 Place two "AA" size batteries, matching the + and - signs on each battery to the + and - signs of the battery compartment.



- 3 Replace the battery cover until the lock snaps.

TIPS FOR BEST OPERATION

- For optimum performance, aim the Remote Control directly at the TV from a distance no more than 23 ft (7m) and be sure there is no obstruction between the Remote Control and the TV.
- If your Remote Control does not always adjust the TV as you wish, you probably need to replace the batteries.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If you do not intend to use the Remote Control for a long period, remove the batteries.

CAUTION:

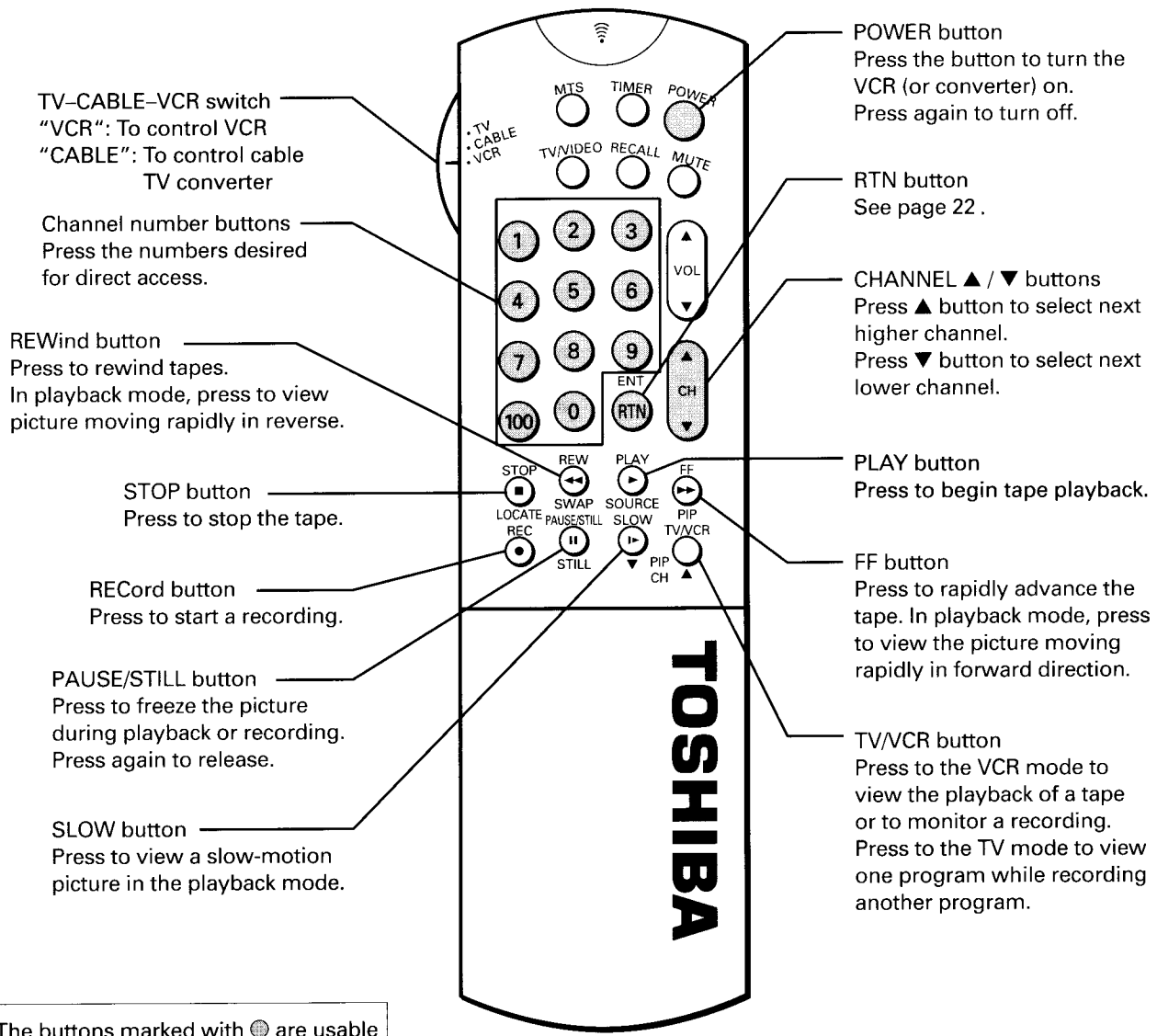
- Do not throw your batteries into a fire. Dispose of your batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Do not combine used old batteries with new ones.
- Do not mix battery types.

Location of controls (Remote Control) / Before using the Remote Control

USING THE REMOTE WITH VCR OR CABLE TV CONVERTER

- To control TOSHIBA VCR, first set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to "VCR" position. The buttons shown below will then control the VCR. The rest of the buttons operate the TV as usual. If you have another brand of VCR, you can probably program your Remote to control it. Details are on page 13.
- To control a cable TV converter, this Remote Control must be programmed to recognize the brand of your converter. See page 13. Set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to "CABLE" position whenever you control the cable TV converter.

Aim at the VCR or cable TV converter

Channel number buttons
 Press the numbers desired for direct access.

REWind button
 Press to rewind tapes. In playback mode, press to view picture moving rapidly in reverse.

STOP button
 Press to stop the tape.

RECORD button
 Press to start a recording.

PAUSE/STILL button
 Press to freeze the picture during playback or recording. Press again to release.

SLOW button
 Press to view a slow-motion picture in the playback mode.

POWER button
 Press the button to turn the VCR (or converter) on. Press again to turn off.

RTN button
 See page 22.

CHANNEL ▲ / ▼ buttons
 Press ▲ button to select next higher channel. Press ▼ button to select next lower channel.

PLAY button
 Press to begin tape playback.

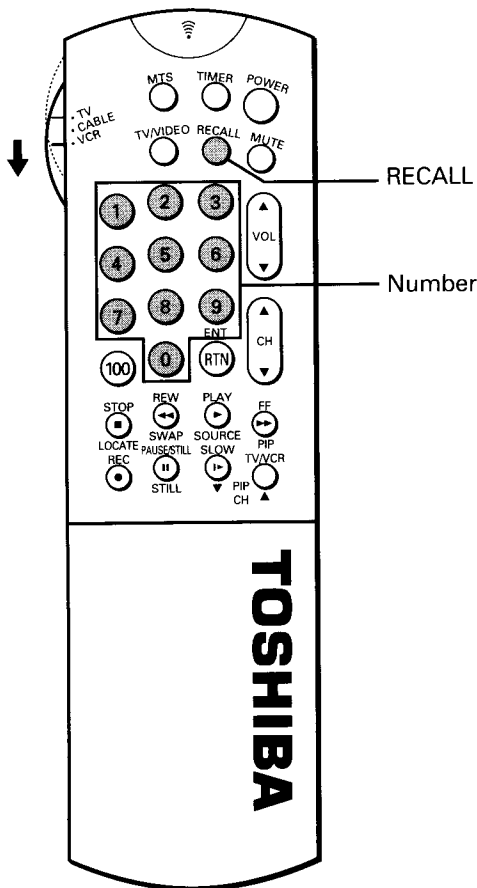
FF button
 Press to rapidly advance the tape. In playback mode, press to view the picture moving rapidly in forward direction.

TV/VCR button
 Press to the VCR mode to view the playback of a tape or to monitor a recording. Press to the TV mode to view one program while recording another program.

The buttons marked with ● are usable to control the cable TV converter

PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- This Remote Control is preprogrammed to operate TOSHIBA VCR's.
- To use VCR's other than Toshiba models (or Cable converter), perform the following procedures before operating.



TO CONTROL OTHER BRANDS OF VCR'S AND CABLE TV CONVERTERS

1 Refer to the "*VCR code table*" (or "*Cable TV converter code table*") on pages 14 and 15 to find the code number that corresponds to the brand name of your VCR (or your converter).

If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.

2 Set the TV-CABLE-VCR switch to VCR (or CABLE).

3 Hold down **RECALL** while pressing the **Number** buttons for the three digit code number for your brand of VCR (or converter). The transmit indicator lights up for 1 second when the programming is completed.

When an operation error has occurred, the indicator blinks. Press **RECALL** again to reset.

4 Point the Remote Control at the VCR (or at the converter) and press **POWER** to test the code number.

- **If the right number was entered**, the VCR should turn on.
- **If the VCR does not respond to the Remote Control**, repeat steps 1 to 4 with another code number.

Notes:

- You have to reprogram the Remote Control when you change its batteries.
- Some newer VCR's are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCR's have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2". If your VCR has this kind of switch, and does not respond to all the code numbers for your VCR brand name, set the switch to another position ("VCR1" or "VCR2") and reprogram the Remote Control.

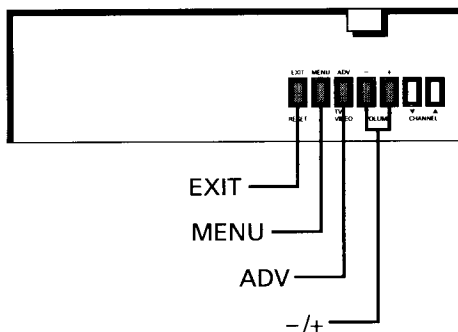

Programming the Remote Control

MENU FUNCTION (General Instructions)

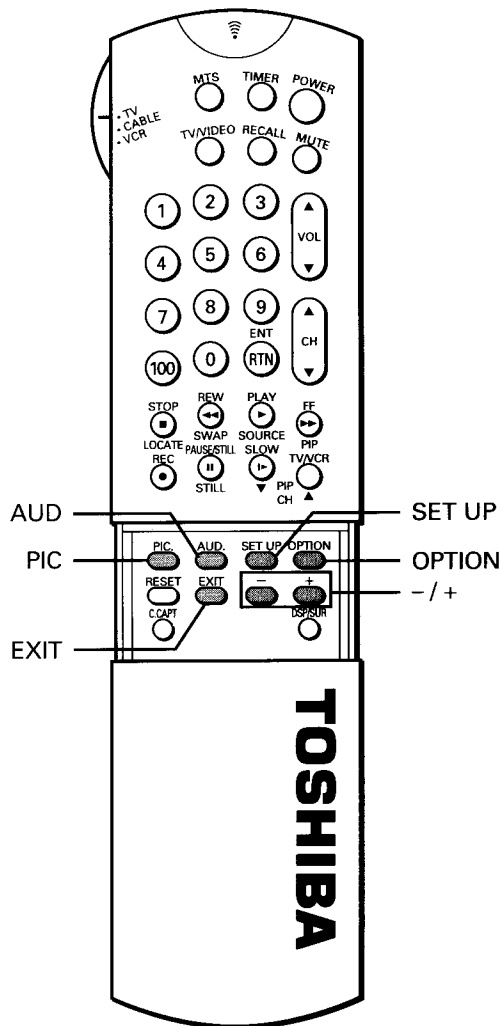
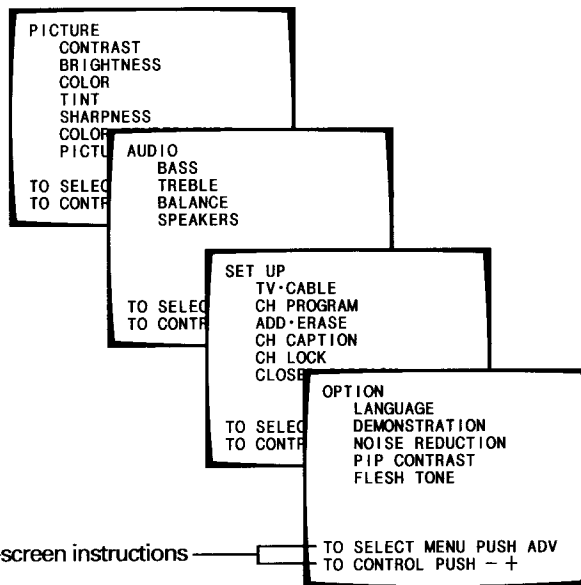
We suggest you familiarize yourself with the procedure before using the Menu function.

To adjust any TV feature, the use of the Menu function is required. The adjustments that can be made to the TV appear on the screen.



MENU BUTTON (on TV)

Each time you press **MENU**, the PICTURE, AUDIO, SET UP or OPTION menu on-screen display is selected in order, then press **ADV**.



ADV BUTTON (on TV)

Use this **ADV** after you have pressed **MENU** to select the function you want to adjust.

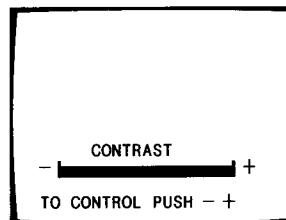
Each time you press **ADV**, the function to be adjusted will be selected in order.

The selected function will be displayed in magenta.

-/+ BUTTONS (on TV and on Remote)

Use these **-/+** after you have pressed **ADV** or any of the four menu buttons (**PIC**, **AUD**, **SET UP** or **OPTION**).

Example: CONTRAST adjustment mode display



Pressing **+** increases the picture contrast.
Pressing **-** decreases the picture contrast.

PIC (Picture) BUTTON (on Remote)

Press **PIC** repeatedly until the PICTURE menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta, then press **-/+** to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 24.

EXIT BUTTON (on TV and on Remote)

The above four menu displays will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds, and all other menu displays also disappear after about 6 seconds. If you want to clear the screen of all on-screen displays instantly, press **EXIT**.

Notes:

- The ADV button on the TV will function as the ANT/VIDEO button when no menu display is on the screen.
- The **-/+** buttons on the TV will function as the VOLUME **▼/▲** buttons when no menu display is on the screen.
- The EXIT button on the TV will function as the RESET button when no menu display is on the screen.

TV CHANNELS

This TV will receive the following TV signals:

1. TV: Off the air TV signals. (VHF channels 2 thru 13 and UHF channels 14 thru 69)
2. STD CABLE: Standard (or IRC: Incremental Related Carrier) cable TV signals.
3. HRC CABLE: Harmonic Related Carrier cable TV signals.
4. IRC CABLE: Incremental Related Carrier cable TV signals.

For each of these systems, your TV has exact frequencies built into it to ensure precise tuning. For precise tuning, the TV-CABLE function must be set to match your TV or CABLE system. (See page 19.) The following chart shows channels available in each system and how your TV displays them. When you connect your TV to a cable TV system and if you are not sure what system they are using, proceed with the following section "HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM" or consult your local cable company to check if your system is STD, HRC or IRC.

HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM

- 1** Select the "STD CABLE" mode following the instructions on page 19.
- 2** Select various channels and confirm whether the channel will lock immediately with perfect picture. If the channels seem to take a few seconds to lock in, your cable system may be one of the other cable systems. In this case, continue with the following steps.
- 3** Select the "HRC CABLE" mode and try above procedure again.
- 4** If you are having problems with only channel 5 or 6, you may have an IRC system so change the mode to the "IRC CABLE".

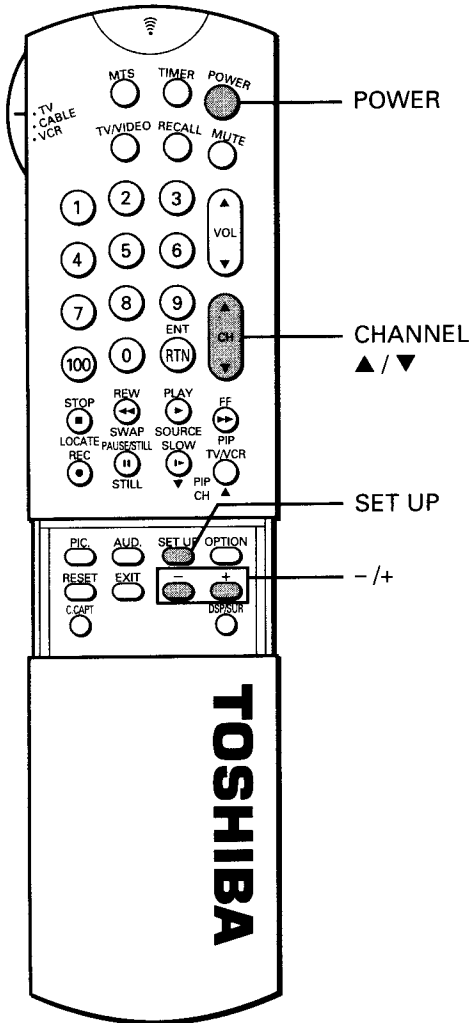
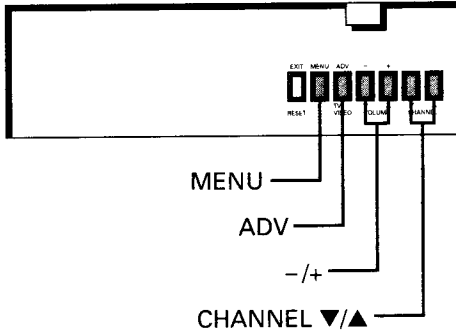

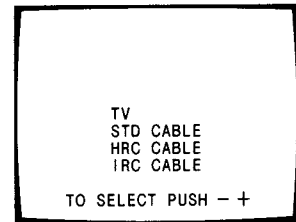
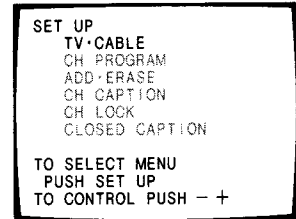
PROGRAMMING CHANNEL MEMORY

The channel memory is the list of TV channel numbers your TV will stop on when you press the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button. **First, use the TV-CABLE and CHANNEL PROGRAM functions to preset all active channels in your area automatically.** If necessary, arrange the preset channels with the ADD/ERASE functions so that you can tune into only desired channels.



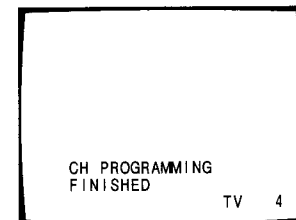
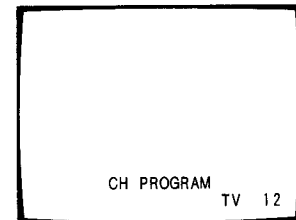
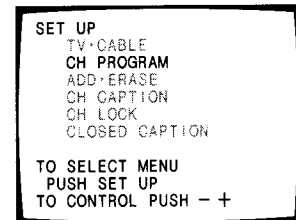
TV-CABLE FUNCTION

- 1 Press **POWER** to turn on the TV.
- 2 Press **SET UP** on the Remote Control (or **MENU** on the TV) to display the SET UP menu on the screen.

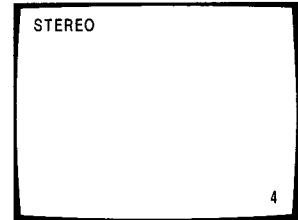
SELECTING STEREO/SAP BROADCASTS

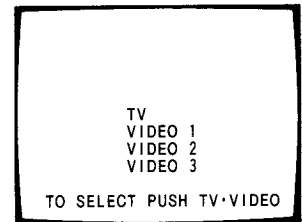
Connect VIDEO1, VIDEO2 or VIDEO3 IN jacks on the TV rear panel to the video/audio output jacks of a VCR, video disc player, comcorder, etc. for playback of video material.



TO SELECT VIDEO INPUT SOURCE

To operate your TV and video equipment properly, refer to the instructions furnished with the video equipment.

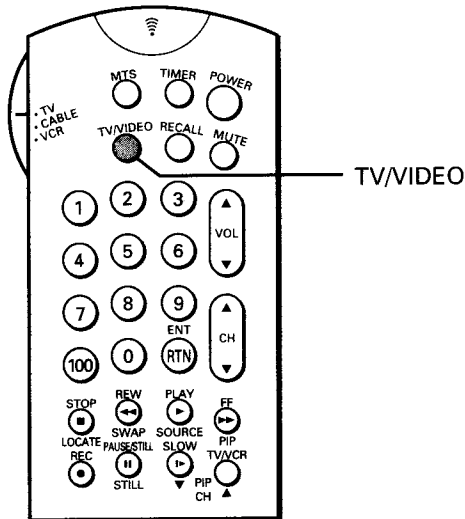
- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- 2 Press **TV/VIDEO** on the Remote Control or on the TV to select the appropriate source:
Each time you press **TV/VIDEO**, TV, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, or VIDEO 3 source will be selected in order.
Press **TV/VIDEO** until "VIDEO 1", "VIDEO 2" or "VIDEO 3" is displayed in magenta.



- 3 Operate your VCR normally.

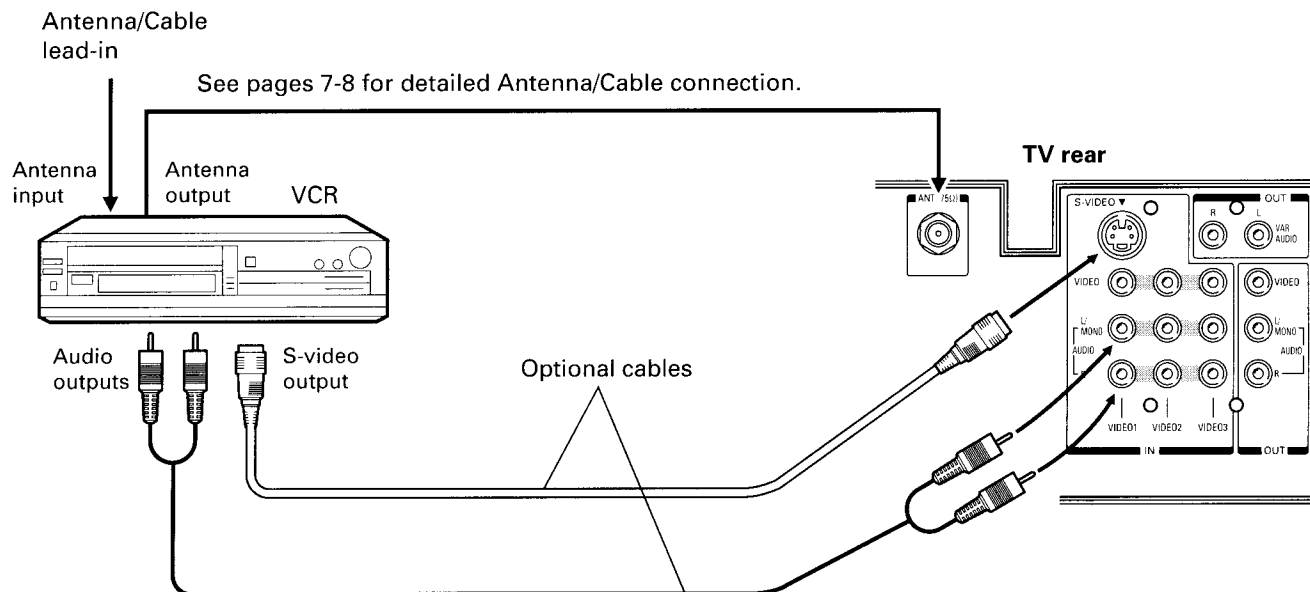
Notes:

- The VIDEO 2 IN jacks can also be used for connecting a second piece of video equipments with video/audio outputs. To view video from equipment connected to the VIDEO 2 IN jacks, select "VIDEO 2".
- The VIDEO 3 IN jacks can also be used for connecting a third piece of video equipments with video/audio outputs. To view video from equipment connected to the VIDEO 3 IN jacks, select "VIDEO 3".
- If you connect a monaural VCR, connect the audio output of the VCR to the L/MONO jack of VIDEO 1/2/3 on the TV.



CONNECTING A VCR WITH AN S-VIDEO JACK

If you connect a VCR with an S-video jack to the "S-VIDEO" jack on the back of the TV, you must also connect the audio cables to the AUDIO jacks of "VIDEO 1 IN" on the back of the TV. The S-video cable only carries the video signal. Audio signals are separate.



TO SELECT VIDEO INPUT SOURCE

- 1 Turn the TV and VCR ON.
- 2 Press **TV/VIDEO** to select the "VIDEO 1" mode.
- 3 Operate your VCR normally.

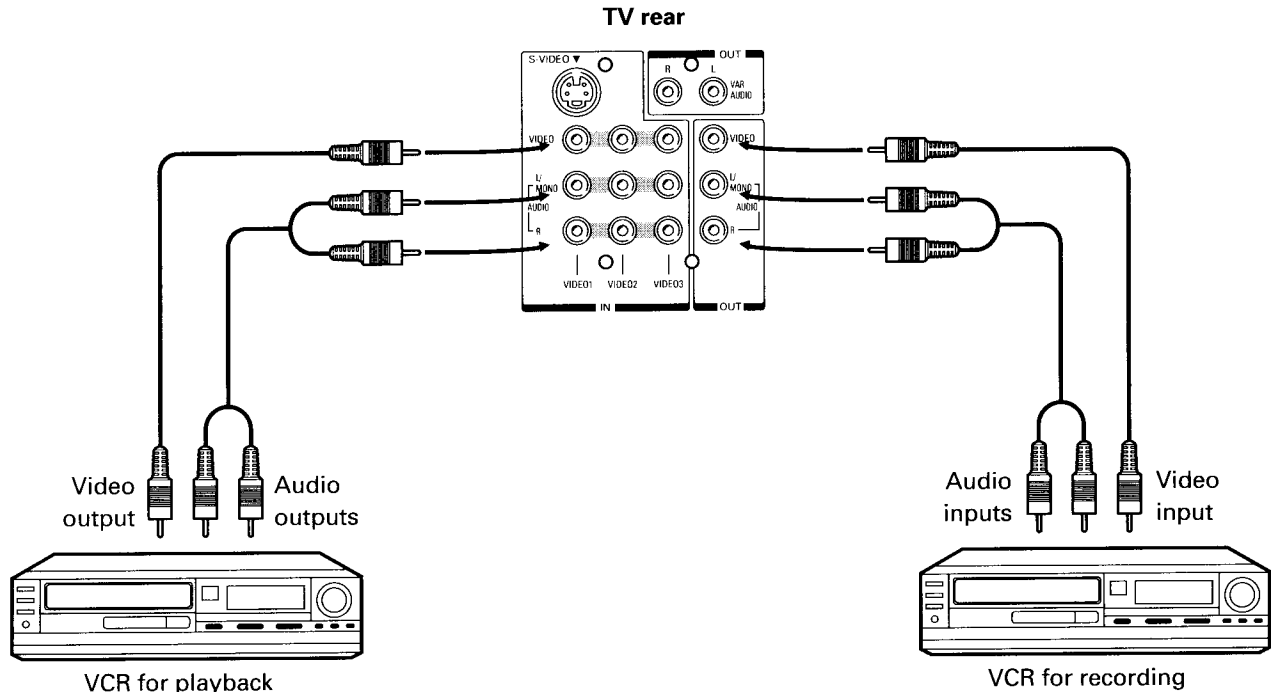
Notes:

- The S-VIDEO jack has priority over the phone-type (yellow) video jack when both are used.
- The S-VIDEO terminal accepts SEPARATED Luminance/Chrominance (Y-C) signals conforming to the NTSC standard.

DUBBING/EDITING VIDEO TAPES USING 2 VCRs

To dub or edit your own video tapes between one VCR and another, connect the VCR that will play to the input jacks (VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 or VIDEO 3) on the TV. Then connect the output jacks from the TV to the input jacks on the recording VCR.

Note: Do not connect one VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.



TO MONITOR YOUR DUBBING/EDITING

- 1 Turn the TV and both VCR's ON.
- 2 Press **TV/VIDEO** on the Remote Control or on the TV to select the "VIDEO 1" mode.
- 3 Set the VCR for recording to record mode and the VCR for playback to play.
- 4 You can view the video tape from the VCR for playback on the TV screen while dubbing it with the VCR for recording.

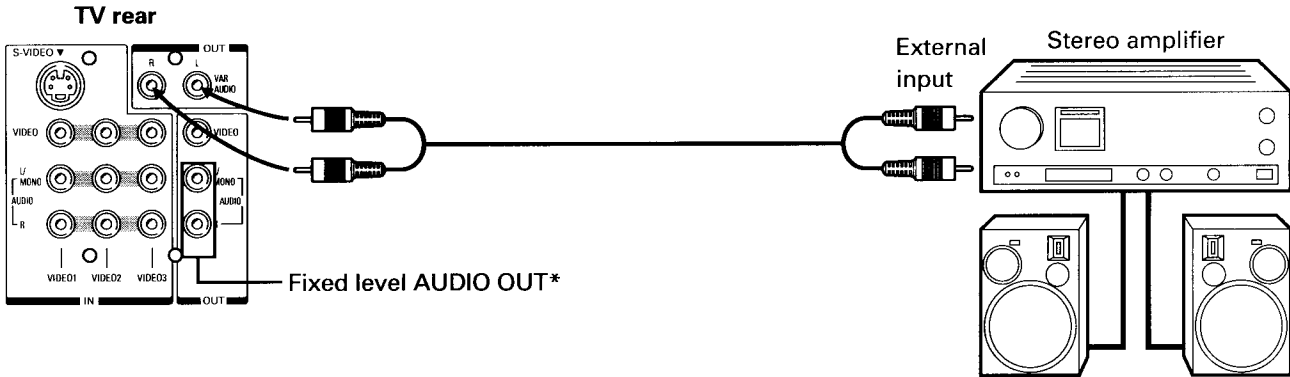

- The input switch of the VCR is normally in the TV position. Change the switch of recording VCR to the LINE or CAMERA position when using the video/audio inputs of the VCR as above. Some VCR's automatically switch when the cables are plugged into the video/audio inputs.
- The PIP picture cannot be output from the VIDEO OUT jack.

CONNECTING AN AUDIO AMPLIFIER

Connect the VARIABLE AUDIO OUT jacks to the external input jacks on the stereo amplifier. You will be able to change and mute volume with the TV's remote control. You will also be able to control bass, treble and balance functions.



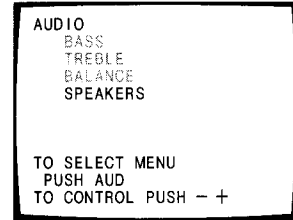
* The "fixed level" audio signal present at the AUDIO jacks of VIDEO/AUDIO OUT jacks is also ideal for connecting an audio cassette recorder (or amplifier) to record audio from the TV. This constant audio signal is not affected by pressing VOLUME buttons on the TV or the TV's remote control.

PREPARING FOR USE

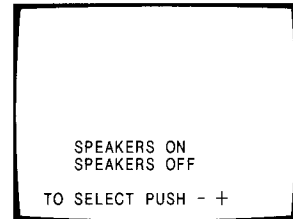
- 1 Turn the TV and stereo amplifier ON.
- 2 Adjust the VOLUME control on the TV for a moderate listening level.
- 3 Disconnect the built-in speakers following the instructions at the right.
- 4 Adjust the volume control on the stereo amplifier for a moderate listening level.
- 5 Control of the audio can now be done using the audio function buttons (VOLUME, MUTE, BASS, TREBLE and BALANCE) on the TV's remote control.

TO DISCONNECT THE BUILT-IN SPEAKERS

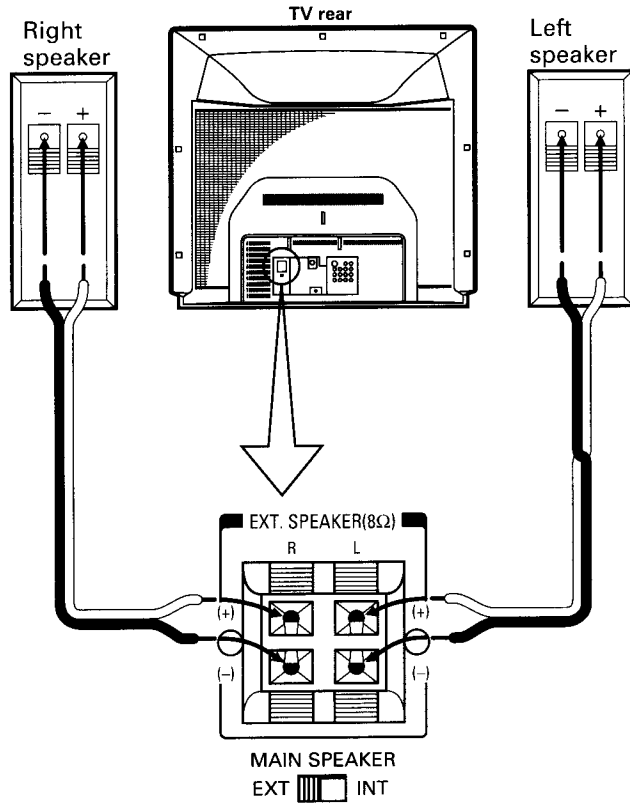

CONNECTING EXTERNAL SPEAKERS

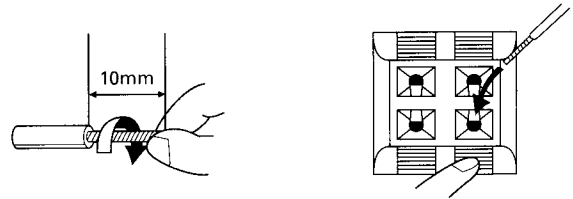
You can connect speakers to the EXTERNAL SPEAKER terminals on the TV set to enhance sound from the TV.

Before connecting the speakers, turn the TV off.



PREPARING FOR USE

- 1 Connect the speaker leads. While depressing the button, insert the wire. Then, release the button. Match the right and left channels and +/- polarities of the TV speaker terminals and external speakers.



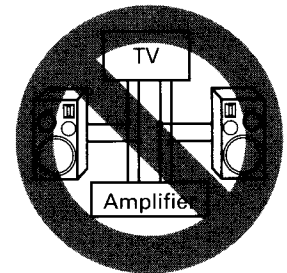
Twist wire core.

- 2 Set the MAIN SPEAKER switch to "EXT". The built-in TV speakers are disconnected.



CAUTIONS:

- Do not connect external speakers to more than one audio source at a time. You will damage your equipment if you connect the same speaker system to both the TV and amplifier.
- Use only external speakers with an impedance rating of 8 ohms and input power of 10 W or greater.



CLEANING AND CARE

WARNING: TV sets use High Voltage. Do not try to remove the cabinet back. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

■ To clean the TV screen:

1. First remove the plug from the power outlet to avoid possible shock hazard.
2. Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen. Water spills into the cabinet may cause damage to the TV. Avoid excess water.
3. Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.

- To maintain the finish and appearance of the cabinet, polish it from time to time with a quality furniture polish.

Note: Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene or other chemicals on or near cabinet, as they might damage the finish of the cabinet.
